Perry v. Schwarzenegger, <u>3:09-CV-02292</u> (Challenge to California's Proposition 8)

The 2010 bench trial was recorded in 62 video files (approximately 163GB). These files are in the public domain and are also available streaming at: https://www.youtube.com/usdccand.

Video naming protocol: All video file names are labeled by "YEAR-MONTH-DATE\_\_TIME (24hr)".

Ex: "2010-01-12\_\_13h-33m-58s.mp4" would be a recording starting at 1:33:58 PM on January 12, 2010.

Compatible media player: VideoLAN's VLC Media Player, available for free at <a href="http://www.videolan.org">http://www.videolan.org</a>, has been tested; other media players may or may not work.

## NOTES:

- Audio may be missing at the very beginning of a recording, due to the sound feed being turned on after the videorecording began. Skip forward to hear the sound.
- There are two different types of video files: MP4 and MPG. The MP4 files are smaller (per duration) and were recorded using a different method than the MPG files.
- The MPG video recordings on 1/11/2010, part of 1/13/2010, and part of 1/25/2010 are a bit "shaky" as they appear to pause for a fraction of a second every few seconds. This is due to a problem with the recording device used at the time. The videos are seen here due to the fact that there was a problem with the primary videos, so the secondary recordings were substituted. The sound is normal.
- The clock indicator within the video (in the upper-right corner of the screen) is the best indicator of the actual recording time.
