Dixie Fire Talking Points, Updated 1400 July 14, 2021

- The safety of our customers and communities is PG&E primary responsibility.
- PG&E continues the monitor the Dixie Fire in Butte and Plumas counties, and we have crews on-site to support first-responders.
- Late this morning several transmission lines lost power from the Dixie Fire's smoke. Approximately 10,000 PGE customers in Plumas County lost power. We restored power to all customers by 2 p.m.
- The fire is near the footprint of the Camp Fire.

If asked:

- Did PG&E assets start the fire? Please check with Cal Fire. We don't have access to the site as it's an active fire.
- Did you have outages in that area close to when the fire started? We don't have access to the site as it's an active fire.
- Is this fire in or near the footprint of the Camp Fire? Yes, it's in the Feather River Canyon in Butte County.

Background:

- At 9:30 a.m., Cal Fire's Butte Unit Tweeted that: "Fire is 1200 acres, burning to the north away from populated areas. Large resource orders are happening."
- Cal Fire's web page describes the Dixie Fire as being located above the Cresta Dam in the Feather River Canyon in Butte County.
