Dixie Fire Triggers Widespread Power Outages in Plumas County

PLUMAS COUNTY, Calif. — The Dixie Fire triggered widespread outages that left thousands of people without power in Plumas County on Wednesday.

Around 11 a.m., a transmission line was automatically de-energized due to smoke and heat from the fire, **according to PG&E Spokesperson Paul Moreno.**

That left more than 11,000 customers without electricity in Plumas County. The power outages are affecting communities on Lake Almanor, Greenville, and parts of Quincy.

PG&E crews are working on the issue and power has been restored to some, **according to Moreno.**

The Dixie Fire started in the Feather River Canyon Tuesday night. It has burned at least 1,200 and has spread from Butte into Plumas County, according to Cal Fire.

The fire is burning to the north away from populated areas and is no longer actively burning in Butte County.
