Progress to Date/Barriers to Progress:

Progress:

- The committee reviewed California S.B.151 to eliminate triplicate prescriptions and H.R. 1863 the National Pain Care Policy Act of 2003. Action requests were sent to the board, and upon approval the committee drafted a letter of support for each bill. These letters were signed and sent to the appropriate congressional members from our organization. SB1278 and H.R. 2507 "Conquering Pain Act of 2003" which have been sponsored in the Senate and House as companion bills were reviewed for content by the committee members. Their progress in will be monitored.
- Each committee member continues to work with their assigned 2 3 local chapters of ASPMN as a liaison to the Government Relations Committee.**
- The Legislative Web Page Task Force has begun work on the content for the legislative web page.
 Members include: Claudia Campbell, Chair; Ann Mroz, Jeri Davis, and Pamela Wheelis, Staff. They will coordinate with Rob Montgomery, web editor and Charles Dorsett, Staff.
- An abstract proposal has been submitted to the 2004 ASPMN Planning Committee for a general session and will focus on educating the membership regarding the legislative process. We are waiting for their response to our abstract.

Barriers:

Participation on conference calls has been minimal for the past several months. Staff member Pamela
Wheelis sends out reminders with the minutes and again 3 – 5 days before the conference call. The
committee members participating in the most recent conference call were given an opportunity to
identify any barriers they have experienced to active membership on the committee. Chair will
personally contact non-active members to determine status.

Current Status/Target Date for Completion:

- Committee members are beginning and continuing to work on establishing a relationship with each
 ASPMN Chapter they have been assigned. Staff is in the processing of reviewing chapter reports for
 evidence of legislative activity so we can be sure to identify active chapters.
- The work of the Legislative Web Page Task Force has begun. Assignments have been made. Timeline for draft of content is September 15, 2003. Content to be reviewed with Charles Dorsett, Staff, before the end of the month. Goal is to have web page up and running 3 4 months prior to our annual meeting so that any problems can be addressed. The committee has submitted an abstract for general session presentation including introduction to the web page for the annual meeting 2004 in Myrtle Beach.

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Staff Support:

Pamela Wheelis supports the committee by arranging conference calls, reminding members via email, taking minutes, and acts as a resource. Charles Dorsett will be needed, as the Task Force takes on the job of drafting web site content.



'The American Society for Pain Management Nursing (ASPMN) was outraged when our name preceded the unbalanced front-page story, Lewis speaks out against 'dope' for agony. Lewis (a paid neurostimulator spokesperson) is an expert on his own pain, but is clearly not a pain management expert.

We want to clarify that views expressed in this article, do not reflect those of ASPMN, a nursing organization dedicated to promoting optimal pain management for all. Most of the 50 million Americans with persistent pain are under-treated, in part because unbalanced media, like The Sun News, peddles more fear than facts.

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David E. Joranson, MSSW

David Joranson is Senior Scientist and Director of the Pain & Policy Studies Group (PPSG) at the University of Wisconsin Comprehensive Cancer Center. In the 70s and 80s he was administrator of the Wisconsin Controlled Substances Board where he developed an interagency program that addressed successfully the problem of prescription drug abuse and diversion. He was invited by the White House to plan a national conference on misuse, abuse and diversion of prescription-controlled substances. In the late 80s, David became concerned about the effects of the war on drugs on pain management, and left government to start the PPSG and to develop a systematic approach to evaluating federal and state policies for "balance," so that policies aimed at preventing diversion and drug abuse do not interfere in pain management.

Mr. Joranson also leads the World Health Organization's efforts to achieve more balanced narcotics control policy in the world. The PPSG is also a WHO Collaborating Center; it prepared WHO guidelines for evaluating the degree of 'balance' in the narcotics control laws and regulations in any country. The PPSG guidelines are now being used to improve national policies in Africa, Asia, Latin America and Eastern Europe. David's work has been recognized by the National Association of State Controlled Substances Authorities, the Wisconsin Cancer Pain Initiative and the American Pain Society. He recently received a Humanitarian Award for his efforts to enhance care in patients dealing with addiction and pain.

Dr. Rich received his BA in history from DePauw University in Greencastle, IN, his JD degree from Washington University in St. Louis MO in 1973, and his PhD in philosophy in 1995 from the University of Colorado at Boulder. Prior to becoming a full-time academic, his legal career of nearly 20 years included the following positions: litigation partner in a Raleigh, North Carolina health law firm (1976-1980), administrative law judge (1980-82), legal counsel to the University of North Carolina Hospitals and Clinics (1982-84), Senior Resident Counsel at the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center (1984-86), General Counsel for the University of Colorado system (1986-1990), and Visiting Associate Professor at the University of Colorado School of Law (1990-91).

From 1995 to January of 2000, he was Assistant Director of the Program in Health Care Ethics, Humanities and Law and a faculty member of the Department of Preventive Medicine and Biometrics at the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center in Denver. He served on Institutional Review Boards at both the Health Sciences Center and the AMC Cancer Research Center.

Since February of 2000, he has been an Associate Professor of Bioethics at the University of California-Davis School of Medicine with faculty appointments in the Departments of Internal Medicine and Anesthesiology and Pain Medicine. He is also a Visiting Professor at the University of California-Davis School of Law teaching courses in health care law.

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- Pain keeps women away from their jobs, hurts their families and their community.
- · Pain is a women's health issue.
- There is a growing body of literature that indicates that women are more likely than men to be under treated for their pain. Women are more likely to be given a sedative for their pain, while men are more likely to be given pain medication.
- It appears that gender affects not only pain perception, pain coping, and pain reporting, but also pain-related behaviors, including use of healthcare and the social welfare system.
- From a study of Health Care Provider attitudes, regarding women and men in pain, most Health Care Providers felt:
 - Women were less sensitive to pain
 - ▶ Women were more tolerant of pain
 - ▶ Women were less distressed as a result of pain
 - Women were more likely to report pain and to express pain through nonverbal gestures.

"Ours has aptly been characterized as 'the culture of pain," says Dr. Rich, "one in which the pain of all patients -- young and old, male and female, wealthy and poor, temporarily ill or at the end of their life -- has been systematically under treated. That culture has been nurtured by rampant opiophobia and the cultivated ignorance of health care professionals of current knowledge and skills in pain assessment and management. Gradually and belatedly, a small but determined cadre of caring persons has begun the process of transforming the culture of pain through moral suasion, professional education, public policy formulation, and, in a few dramatic cases, legal action. This presentation is a celebration of and rededication to that transformative endeavor."

Ben A. Rich, JD, PhD, Associate Professor of Bioethics at the University of California Davis School of Medicine, received his law degree from Washington University in St. Louis in 1973. Dr. Rich's experience as an attorney includes private practice in North Carolina as a litigation and health law specialist, an administrative law judge, counsel to two academic medical centers, and General Counsel of the University of Colorado system. Dr. Rich has lectured and published extensively on the topics of informed consent, advance directives, pain management, and end-of-life care. In 2001, he delivered the 12th Annual Hamilton S.
