Event Evaluation

How do you currently use ACTIQ in your practice (think about patient types and desired outcomes)?

- A lot: for acute pain, cancer pain, chronic benign pain
- For breakthrough pain for chronic pain usually of musculoskeletal origin.
- Breakthrough pain in opioid tolerant
- Cluster HA, CLBP
- Mostly chronic post-surgery, back and neck pain, severe degen. Conditions, OA, RA – my practice is mostly ortho and musculoskeletal
- Not using much ACTIQ – familiarity and cost
- Headache, breakthrough pain, 1 degree med for pain
- Migraines, beginning of breakthrough pain
- Chronic, malignant and non malignant pain
- Pre med for painful procedures, break-thru med when GI transit is a problem
- Primarily headache but in a variety of pain states, particularly with rapid onset of pain. Excellent at keeping patients out of the ER.
- 1 degree for breakthrough pain in cancer patients and in selected hospitalized patients with episodic pain
- Breakthrough neuropathic pain and intractable headache
- Use for severe breakthrough for general pain, for migraines, to prevent ER visits and occasionally as sole pain medicine
- I am ACTIQ naive
- 90% of my ACTIQ patients have inflammatory bowel disease (Crohn's, UC) and short gut syndrome. They cannot take pills (poor absorption). Duragesic/ACTIQ allow me to discharge them with pain control.
- Not really using much – haven't had a "good feel" f or it so warming up slow. This meeting really helped.
- Yes.
- I have never used ACTIQ.
- Acute flare-ups (breakthrough pain), episodic headaches, cluster headaches
- Migraine Has, with duragesic for breakthrough and control of episodic pain
- Yes with excellent outcomes.
- Headache, breakthrough pain and keeping patients out of the ER.
- I've tried to use ACTIQ twice but have not been able to get the prescription filled as I do not see cancer patients. I will continue to try; prescribe this for other patients.
- As breakthrough med – usually with those patients already on Duragesic
- Yes – chronic pain
- For breakthrough – usually with patch Oxycontin
- I use it in patients who have painful dressing changes at home; migraine HAs that take them to ER; cancer patients'; some OA patients; some chronic CBP patients and significant BTP
- Migraine patients who have problems and severe N/V
- Migraine unrelieved with Triptan x2, breakthrough arthritic pain
- Patients on long-acting opiates with severe breakthrough pain who are competent to self-administer.
- Cancer and headache breakthrough pain
- For chronic pain patients – breakthrough
- Malignant pain, breakthrough pain in malignant and nonmalignant pain, headache rescue to avoid ER Rx.

- Management of the endocrine side effects of the light doses of the fentanyl
- Have printed versions of the slides so we can take more relevant notes and not waste time copying slide info.
- You need a speaker who is experienced in treating addicts. Not someone who only is involved in detoxing addicts.
- 4As
- Most physicians recognize narcotic value but fear political issues. Suggest crafting a format for political action-support.
- More discussion of future treatment options in the future.
- Changing the philosophy of treatment with long-acting agents to short-acting agents.
- These lecturers are excellent, although I'm certain they are not always available. "PCA on stick" is potent if understood in a gestalt of proper concerns for potency, etc. The major thread is the very real breakthrough that this (Actiq) represents in outpatient opioid therapy.
- Use of opioid and non-opioid meds – multimodal therapy.
- Better delineation of off-label use
- Discuss other modalities, ie. Pumps, prolotherapy, manipulation
- Broader, non-official indication for migraine, low back pain.
- Good discussion on treating chronic pain.
- Study designs for non-cancer pain
- Discuss "off label use" is ok and not going to get a physician in legal trouble.

- ACTIQ for headache, concept of ACTIQ replacing long-acting agents in certain syndromes.
- I was very impressed by questions I have to raise with myself about "rules" such as always preferring a long-acting with a short-acting agent (especially for some patients and headache or natural short-term pathophysiology). Use prior to procedures. Better ability for patients to modulate their medications when needed.
- Pharmacology, applications of ACTIQ
- Issues of bio-availability
- 4As – a good tool for notes. Hearing alternative methods to treat some pain
