Let's get movement off the shelves in these targeted pharmacies to show the demand we can generate with Opana ER!

The purpose of this e-mail is to close the loop from e-mails earlier in the week stemming from the RD meeting with respect to stocking at W-G. We can confirm the following:

- 1. Per Lisa Walker we shipped W-G to W-G's DC 1512 bottles of Opana 5 mg IR, 5mg ER and 20mg ER.
- 2. The attached report generated from W-G's system shows the store address and zip code of the stores they had forced stocked at the time they ran the report on 10/19. The column entitled "ordered is what the store ordered actually W-G corporate decided what stores would receive the bottles abased on CII activity at the respective store and the column entitled "billed" is when the the product arrived and was billed to the store. (W-G internal accounting charges the store for the value of the bottle "ordered") Mostly, there is 1 bottle ordered and 1 bottle billed. In some cases it shows 2 bottles billed. This is due to either more Rx's or W-G as they said they would do putting more product in a W-G higher CII store. In some cases it shows -0- billed. This is because we were insisting on getting a report of the stocking and it had not been fully completed. hence, 1,482 bottles shipped out leaving 30 bottles back in the W-G DC on date of report.

We have not contacted W-G again because there is no need as this report was taken directly from W-G system. The benefit is that we can use the zip code and store address information to focus attention on those physicians in these zip codes to go to W-G stores. I would also reiterate that pharmacists because of Oxycontin experience have been trained to deny when queried in detail either in person or by phone that they carry any extensive inventory of opiate analysis, and respond only to patients with Rx's.

Hopefully this will allay any concerns that W-G has not stocked the 3 strengths. Creating demand generation at these stores could help us in not only re-orders but also in stocking expansion in other W-G stores.
